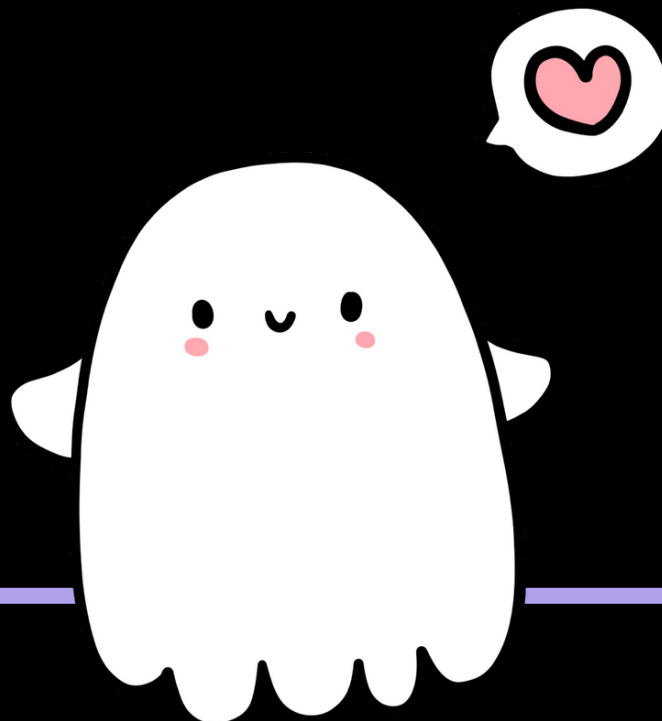

# Editor Pete Suggests

## Stranger in the Alps

By now Phoebe Bridgers is a staple of popular music culture. Due to her popularity and the dark subject matter of her music, it would be easy to disregard her work as dark for the sake of being edgy. An open minded listen to her



2017 album ***Stranger in the Alps*** instead reveals the disarmingly genuine thoughts of a woman processing through her darkest memories and thoughts.

Bridgers' evocative phrasing and keen self awareness imbue ***Stranger in the Alps*** with cutting honesty.

Where she *could* have written "I've been struggling to handle life lately" she instead pens the infinitely more evocative "I've got a stack of mail and a tall can: It's a shower beer, it's a payment plan."



Instrumentally, the album is filled with lulling guitar, melancholic piano, and crooning Theremin, sometimes joined by drums or violins. This cast of instruments creates an anxious, intimate vibe which harmonizes perfectly with Bridgers' Lyrics. Sonically the album feels spooky but definitely not cheesy.

Some people believe music that discusses difficult themes is harmful. Such music, it is argued, can only serve to darken the listeners' outlook on life. My experience has consistently been the opposite. Music that discusses difficult themes (like ***Stranger in the Alps***) has helped me feel understood during tough times

in my life. Some troubles can at first feel too difficult to discuss with others. Art can serve as a safe place to find company and gain the courage to seek help.

If you, too, love ***Stranger in the Alps*** then ***don't be a stranger!*** Let me know next time you visit Ogden Farmers' Library!
